The Honorable Tim Eichenberg
New Mexico State Treasurer

Tim Eichenberg assumed office on January 1, 2015, becoming the 29th State Treasurer of New Mexico. Raised in Albuquerque, he attended Albuquerque Public Schools and graduated from the University of New Mexico. Treasurer Eichenberg and his wife reside in Albuquerque and have two adult children and two dogs.

Treasurer Eichenberg's career in public service began in 1974, when he was elected Bernalillo County Treasurer and served for two terms. He then worked in the private sector, operating a small business in Albuquerque for more than 30 years as a Property Tax Consultant, State Certified Appraiser, General Contractor (GB-98), and Real Estate Broker.

In 1994, Treasurer Eichenberg was elected to the Albuquerque Metropolitan Arroyo Flood Control Authority Board, a position he still holds today. In 2004, he was appointed by Governor Bill Richardson to the position of New Mexico State Property Tax Director.

In 2008, Treasurer Eichenberg was elected to the New Mexico State Senate. During his tenure, he served on the Public Affairs and Judiciary committees, and as Chair of the Restructuring Committee and the Revenue Stabilization and Tax Policy Committee. In 2010, then-Senator Eichenberg carried the Governmental Conduct Act, establishing a code of ethics for all government employees.



James E. Glassman

As managing director with JPMorgan Chase and head economist for Chase Commercial Banking, James Glassman provides market insights to help clients better understand the changing economy and its impact on their business. Mr. Glassman also works closely with the firm's corporate sector, including the Chief Investment Office, Investor Relations, Investment Bank group, and Government Relations group, providing financial analysis and research.

A publisher of independent research on the principal forces shaping the economy and financial markets, Mr. Glassman is regularly cited in the financial media, where he is also a frequent commentator on economic policy issues. Additionally, he is a long-standing participant in the widely followed Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia Survey of Professional Forecasters and the National Association of Business Economists' panel of macro-economic forecasters.

From 1979 through 1988, Mr. Glassman served as a senior economist in the Research & Statistics and Monetary Affairs departments at the Federal Reserve Board in Washington, DC. His responsibilities

ranged from analysis and forecasting of inflation and labor market developments, to analysis of the Federal Reserve's operating strategies and interest rate markets, to the development of monetary and reserves projections. He joined Morgan Guaranty in 1988 and then Chemical Bank in 1993, which, through a combination of mergers, became JPMorgan Chase & Co.

Mr. Glassman earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Illinois—Champaign-Urbana and a master's degree in economics from the University of Illinois—Chicago. He was awarded a PhD in economics from Northwestern University.



Deanne Woodring, CFA

Ms. Woodring is a cofounder and principal of Government Portfolio Advisors and serves as President and Senior Portfolio Advisor. Ms. Woodring and her GPA partners have served together as a team since 1983. This fixed-income partnership is likely one of most experienced teams advising public entities in the industry.

Ms. Woodring is responsible for directly advising clients on all aspects of the portfolio-management process, overseeing the management of her company, client relations, and the strategic direction for

investment holdings. She is responsible for managing more than \$5.5 billion in separate portfolios for public entities and consults on an additional \$5 billion. Her clients include state general funds, cities, counties, water districts, power districts, university funds, and other public finance authorities. Assets under management include operating funds, reserve funds, project funds, and bond proceeds. Ms. Woodring works in collaboration with clients to develop best practice procedures, increased accountability, and incorporation of transparent strategies.

Prior to cofounding GPA she was a Managing Director at another public fund registered investment advisor (RIA) from 2002 until 2014. There she was responsible for the management and development of the Portland, Oregon, office, overseeing \$7 billion in total assets.

Ms. Woodring is actively involved nationally in consulting with management teams and public-entity investment staffs on developing short- and long-range investment strategies, risk analysis, and the construction of asset/liability programs for the management for public funds.

Ms. Woodring has been an Investment Advisory Representative since 1995 and currently serves as the investment advisor to the New Mexico State Treasurer's office. In 2006 she was appointed by Oregon's State Treasurer to the Oregon Short-Term Fund Board and serves as an advisor on the Government Finance Officers Association's (GFOA Treasury and Management Committee. She is a speaker at the GFOA's national meetings, and is an active member in many state finance organizations including the New Mexico Finance Officers Association, the Oregon Municipal Finance Officers Association, and the Washington Municipal Finance Officers Association.

Ms. Woodring graduated from the University of Oregon with a bachelor of science degree in finance. She earned a master of business degree from the University of Washington in 2001. She holds the designation of Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA-1989) through the CFA Institute, and is a member of the Portland Society of Security Analysts. She also holds Series 7, 63, 24, and 65 licenses from the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority (FINRA).

Senator Cisneros was elected to the New Mexico State Senate in 1985, representing portions of Taos, Los Alamos, Rio Arriba, and Santa Fe counties. He is presently the Vice Chair of both the Senate Finance Committee and the Revenue Stabilization and Tax Policy Committee. Senator Cisneros is the former Chair of the Senate **Education Committee and the Senate** Conservation Committee. In addition, he is a member of the following: The Legislative Finance Committee, the Radioactive and Hazardous Materials Committee, the Legislative Council, and the Senate Committees' Committee. Senator Cisneros is an advisor to the Committee on Compacts, the Indian Affairs Committee, the Investments and Pensions Oversight

Committee, the Jobs Council, the Land Grant Committee, the Military and Veterans' Affairs Committee, the Science, Technology and Telecommunications Committee, the Transportation Infrastructure Revenue Subcommittee, the Legislative Education Study Committee, and the Water and Natural Resources Committee. He is also the past Chair of the Taos County Commission.

Senator Cisneros retired from Chevron Mining after 32 years, beginning as an underground miner and retiring as the Human Resources Manager. He attended the University of Montana and New Mexico Highlands University.
